Graduate Policy Committee

Annual Report, 2021-2022

During the 2021-2022 regular academic year, the GPC met 19 times.

The GPC revised the following university-wide policies:

• Course Load policy; Graduate Certificate policy; Master's Degree in-Flight to Completing a Doctoral Degree policy; English Language Proficiency Exams for Graduate Admissions policy

Ten programs/units were reviewed as part of their QER:
