- Updates to the Manuscript Clearance Portal language
- Update to the Submission Process in the Manuscript Clearance Portal for Thesis, Treatise, and Dissertation Students who have IRB/IACUC Approvals
- Change to allow The Graduate School's Manuscript Clearance Advisors to make minor, clerical edits to a student's post-defense manuscript on behalf of the student.
