I. Regular Session

The regular session of the 1990-1991 Faculty Senate met on Wednesday, December 5, 1990, at 3:45 p.m. Senate President Alan Mabe presided.

II. Approval of the minutes of October 10 and November 14, 1990

The minutes of October 10 and November 14 were approved as distributed.

III. Approval of the agenda for December 5, 1990

IV. Report of the Steering Committee, F. Leysieffer

The Faculty Senate Steering Committee met twice since our last Faculty Senate meeting and met once with President Sliger. I will list the major issues considered by the Steering Committee this month.

***The Presidential Search Procedure.** All faculty are reminded of the time line for nominations for the presidential search process. Nominations must be in to the Presidential Search Advisory Committee no later than January 4, 1991. You do not need supporting documents to make your nomination. The search committee will contact nominees asking for their applications. All applications must be received no later than January 14, 1991. A letter reminding faculty of this and strongly encouraging nominations has been sent to all FSU faculty.

***American Association of Universities.** The Steering Committee met with Dr. John Ryan, a consultant to the University regarding potential membership of FSU in the American Association of Universities.

***Arts and Sciences Dean Search.** The Steering Committee has been and will continue to meet with candidates for the Dean of Arts and Sciences. Professors Bruce Bickley and Larry Abele were interviewed. Professor Gary Waller from Carnegie-Mellon University is visiting campus this week. Three more candidates will visit after the first of the year.

***Admissions Policies.** The Steering Committee met with Professor Ed Mellon, chair of the Admissions Committee and Dr. Peter Metarko, Director of Admissions regarding admissions policies of the University.

***Budget Reductions.** The Steering Committee discussed with President Sliger the possibility of additional budget cuts after the first of next year. The situation at this point is very unclear, but additional cuts are possible.

V. Report of Standing Committees

- a. Undergraduate Policy Committee, P. Wright
Consideration of courses for the Multicultural Component of Liberal Studies

Senator Wright moved approval of the courses listed in addendum 1 for Multicultural Liberal Studies credit. Each of these courses is a current Liberal Studies course in the indicated area. The Senate approved these courses.

Senator Sandon, chairman of the Multicultural Screening Committee urged departments to speed up the consideration of courses for the multicultural requirement. His committee will be working in January and February to meet the deadline for catalog copy.

VI. Unfinished Business

The Senate had no items of unfinished business today.

VII. University Welfare

Senator Waggaman, chairman of the Library Committee, reported that the Library hours for the holiday period will be from 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays; 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., Saturdays and Sundays. The Library will be closed December 25 and January 1.

Senator Landing expressed displeasure at a recent newspaper article which attacked educators and universities. He asked if the Senate would respond. President Mabe indicated that the Steering Committee would consider the article at their next meeting.

VIII. Announcements of Deans and administrative officers

Dean of the Faculties Steve Edwards announced that the President is considering the possibility of closing the University on December 24 and December 31. The University community will be advised if this option is approved.

IX. Announcements of the President of the University

President Sliger was not available for today's meeting.
